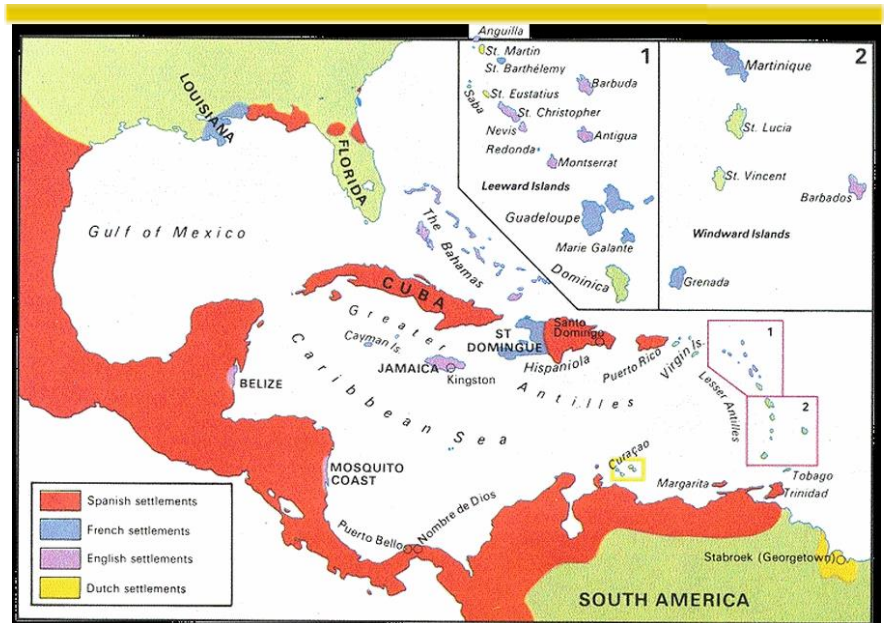

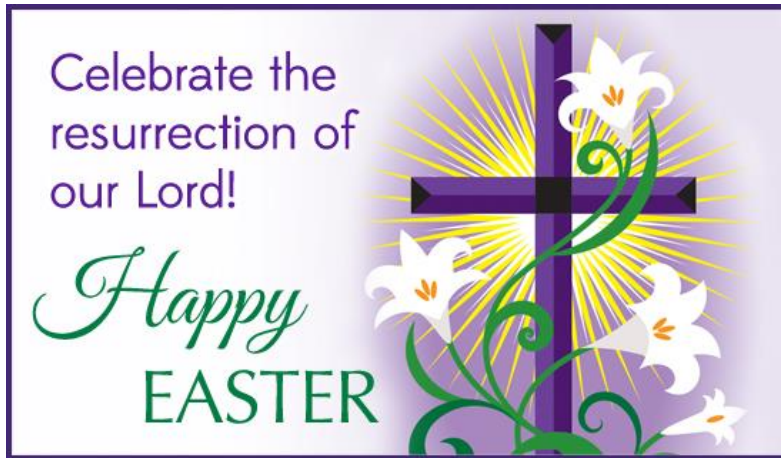


## Career Day at Naz a Massive Success
