



Beyoncé Knowles-Carter returns to the music world with a vengeance. After literally dropping the album out of nowhere on ITunes without any form of promotion, or even an announcement on Twitter, the self-titled album managed to debut at the top of the Billboard 200 chart-making her the first female artist to have five No. 1 albums on the chart. The Affordable Care and Patient Protection Act, otherwise known as "Obamacare", is currently a federal law that will ensure that all Americans have access to quality, affordable health care and will create a major improvement among the health-care system.
