

AP US HISTORY SUMMER ASSIGNMENT

Due: Monday, September 9, 2019

Hello and welcome to the exciting world that is Advanced Placement United States History. This summer's assignment comes as a result of the time constraints placed on us all in covering the immense content in this course (the AP US History exam is usually given the first week of May). To allow for a more in depth study of the various periods of American History, it is necessary to cover some of the early history during the summer individually.

The summer assignment will consist of two parts. The assigned reading will come from our textbook, American History: A Survey by Alan Brinkley. You need to identify the meaning and/or significance of each of the key terms relating to each of the first three chapters AND complete the Reading Questions for each chapter. The second part of the summer assignment will be your first take-home essay which will ask you to synthesize and apply the information you have learned from reading the first three chapters of the text. The terms, questions and essay will be collected on the first day of class and the first chapter quiz is scheduled for the following week. Both parts to the summer assignment may either be hand-written or typed.

Everything done for this course, including this summer assignment, should be your own original thoughts and work. Copying information directly from the Internet, the textbook and/or any other outside source is strictly prohibited. This assignment is also to be completed individually. Working with or copying from another student is also strictly prohibited. Proper citations are ALWAYS necessary if quoting or using information from an outside source. We will review the content and expectations of this course more thoroughly when you are given the syllabus on the first day of classes.
