

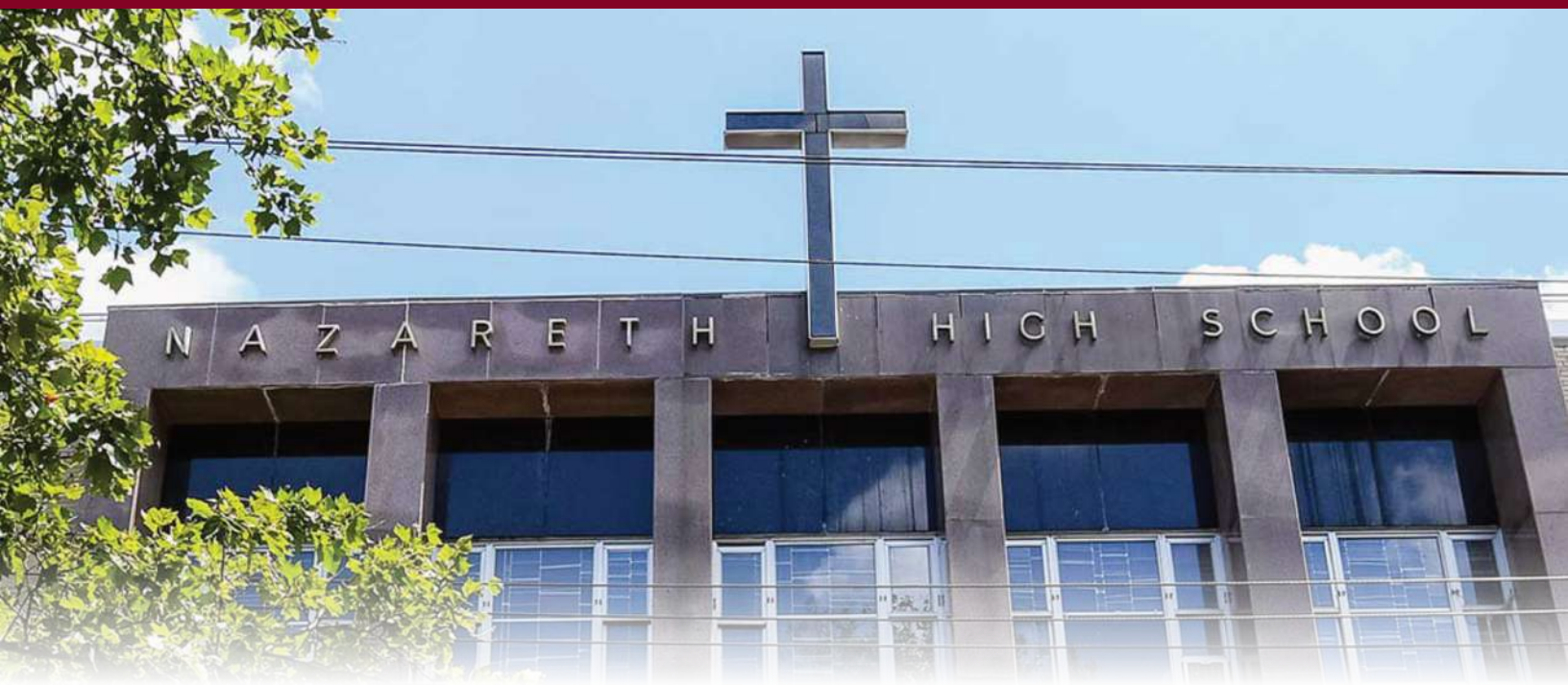

# NAZARETH ACADEMICS

In June 2021, Nazareth graduated 100% of its seniors with 99% of the students being college-bound and 1% entering the military. The rigors of our academic programs are bearing fruit. We are especially proud of our ability to offer such substance despite the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

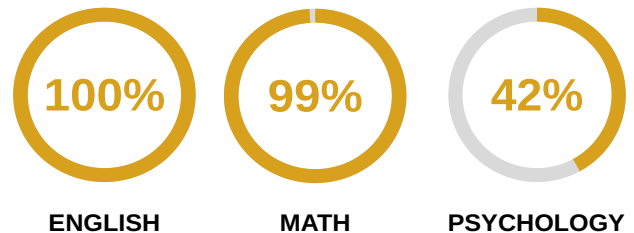
During the 2021-22 school year, all seniors now take a full year of college-level English classes and 99% are also taking a full year of college-level math classes. These classes are offered through affiliations with St. Joseph's and St. Thomas Aquinas colleges. In addition, the number of Advanced Placement (AP) courses and the number of students taking AP courses is expanding annually. This year we added AP Physics 1, AP Seminar and AP Statistics.

To date, more than 50% of all Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors are taking at least one AP class; 30% of our freshmen are taking an AP class. Next year, we will offer AP Research, which will allow our students to become eligible to receive an AP Capstone diploma.

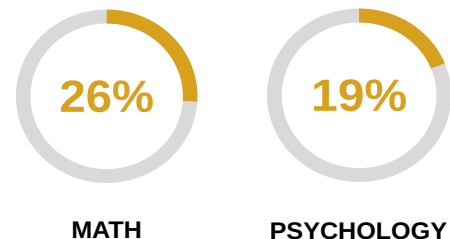
To further propel our students' college preparation, Nazareth has doubled the Freshman math classes this year. Nazareth has 24% of our Freshmen taking two years of mathematics in one year. Our goal is to expand this program in the next few years, ensuring that our students are taking advantage of higher-level mathematics in high school.

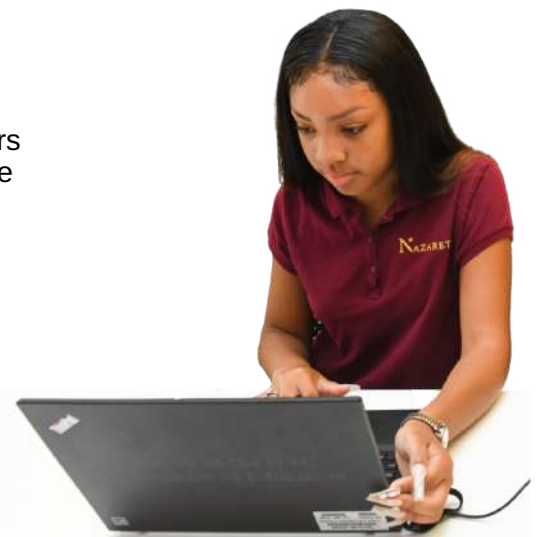




# NAZARETH TECHNOLOGY

As the proverb states, *Necessity is the mother of invention*, and this was certainly true in 2021. At the beginning of the pandemic, most schools were challenged by the need to prepare their students and teachers for virtual learning. **At Nazareth, we were ready from the first day.** All students were equipped with Chromebooks and Teachers with laptops and cameras. Of course, nothing works perfectly from the beginning and our virtual learning program began to evolve.

With COVID-19 and its challenges, we expanded our technology program. Unable to meet in person, the Nazareth community began meeting virtually. This led the way for students to become involved in the actual process of filming and editing as part of our assembly program. Digital Photography, Video Editing, Web Design, 3D Printing, and our Robotics Program emerged as our students applied their critical thinking skills. They worked together in person and virtually and were forced to address real world problems with real solutions.



## FEATURED STUDENT

Meet Tariq Deane, a current senior at Nazareth. He has been hired by Roblox to design assets as a 3D artist with some skills in 2D. He uses software like Blender, Substance Painter, and more to get his 3D models done. He is also a game developer for two top studios.







# NAZARETH SPIRITUALITY

Nazareth continues to have a strong commitment to faith and service while studying the Gospel, the teachings of Christ, under the charism of the Xaverian Brothers. Students internalize these values, not only to better themselves, but to leave a positive imprint on the world.

This school year began with our September 11th Memorial Mass celebrating the sacrifices made by our first responders, including Nazareth Alumni, who sacrificed themselves to save others. This celebration was led by our XBSS students and the spiritual leaders of the school. While it was great to have the students back together, it was a beautiful experience to have the Nazareth community, including some Alumni, share in prayer and faith.

Throughout the year, we continued to strengthen our relationship with the community by participating in service-focused activities and events. For example, in October, our students walked in the Breast Cancer Awareness event and raised money in support of cancer research. During the holidays, Nazareth held a Thanksgiving food drive to collect canned goods and donated them to a local food bank. The students also participated in a Christmas season "Pajama Drive," donating pajamas, clothes, toys, and other items to Hour Children, a local non-profit that provides services to incarcerated and formerly incarcerated women and their children. The spirit of giving in gratitude is the hallmark of the Nazareth culture.

Nazareth students continue to support our community with compassion, as envisioned by Theodore Ryken, founder of the Xaverian Brothers.

### Annual Appeal 2021

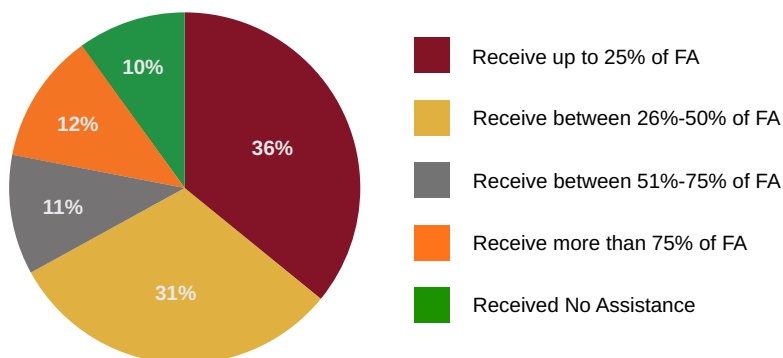

## Class of 1967 Fund

## Detective Dennis Murphy Scholarship

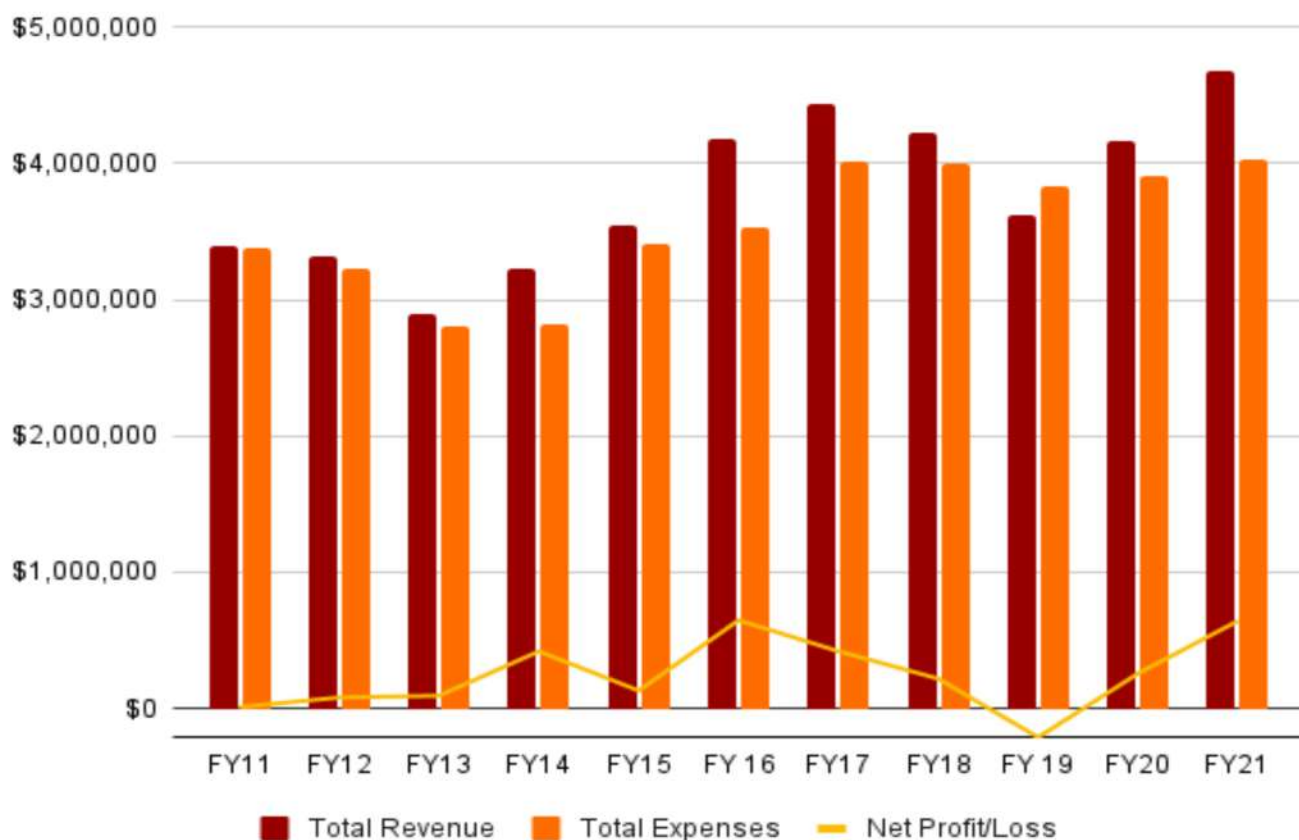

*Fiscal Year (FY) is July 1st to June 30th*

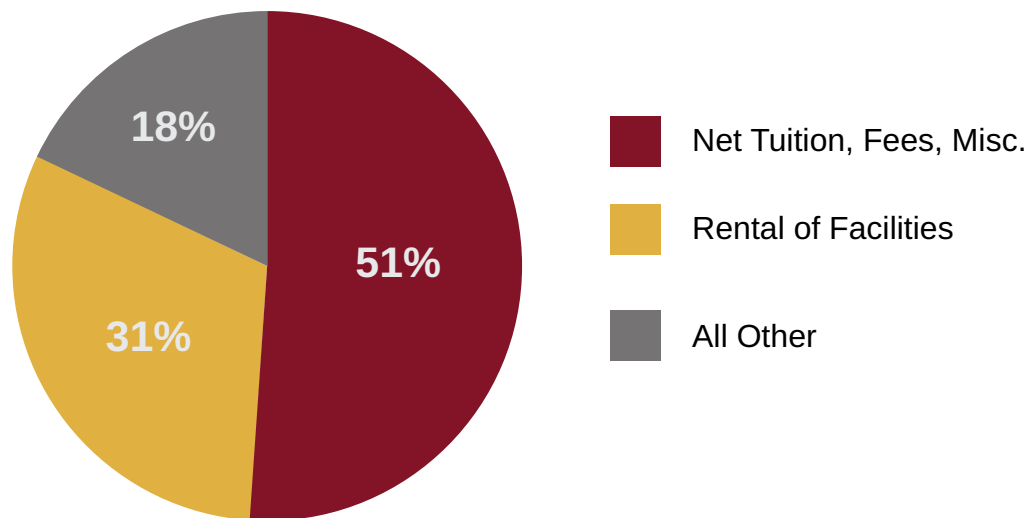

Net Income for Fiscal Year 2021 was \$642,000.



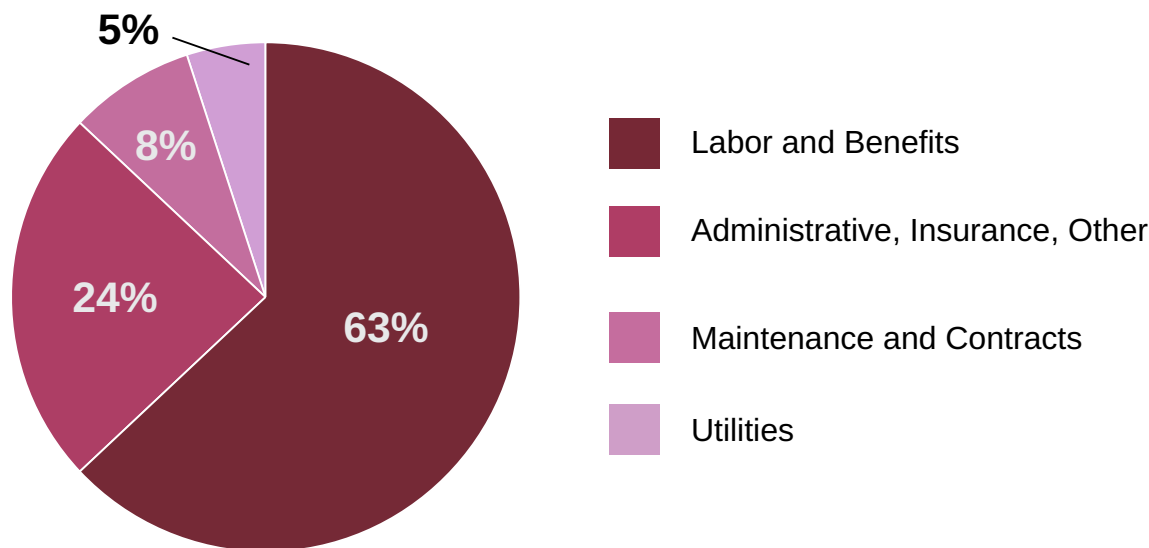
# FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE
